Environment

The "Globalization" Research Chair of the Paris School of Economics is offering a post-doctoral position. The position starts on September 1, 2023, with a contract duration of one year, renewable once. The candidate will work in collaboration with the professors of the International Trade and Trade Policy research group of the Paris School of Economics. The group, composed of Anne Célia Disdier, Lionel Fontagné, Pamina Koenig, Mathieu Parenti, Sandra Poncet, Ariell Reshef and Thierry Verdier, conducts research on globalization and international trade policy issues.

The Globalization Research Chair focuses on current political, geostrategic and technological developments that are reconfiguring international trade. Research projects include modeling and measuring the impact of trade policies, analysis of firms' trade strategies and performance, and structural changes associated with globalization.

Missions

The post-doctoral researcher will carry out research work in the framework of projects related to the Globalization Research Chair. This will include participation in the construction, estimation and use of multi-country and multi-sectoral international trade models that take into account inter-industry relationships (new quantitative trade models) or structural gravity models and global value chains. The post-doctoral fellow will use standard international trade databases (WIOD, TIVA, TRAINS, COMTRADE or BACI...) and Automatic Identification System (AIS) databases for vessel tracking. She/he will also conduct econometric work on individual firm data, notably from Orbis or French data (balance sheet, customs) accessible via the CASD. No teaching tasks are expected.

Profile

The candidate should hold a PhD in Economics (or be about to obtain it) and have strong analytical skills and a high standard of research excellence. The candidate should be fluent in English. Knowledge of French is not required. Experience in quantitative economic modeling/applied econometrics in one or more of the following areas is required: firm-level performance and business practices, trade policy, transportation economics, corporate social responsibility, global value chains. She/he should have the ability to work effectively, both independently and collaboratively, as part of an international team.
