### Workshop on Frontiers in Environmental Economics Paris, December 11 and 12, 2017

We are very glad to announce a workshop organized in Paris next December on the Frontiers in Environmental Economics.

The workshop is organized over two days and we are happy to announce lectures by Philippe Aghion (Harvard and Collège de France), Patrick Bolton (Columbia Business School) t.b.c., Estelle Cantillon (ECARES, Université libre de Bruxelles), and Bård Harstad (University of Oslo).

The aim of the Conference is to provide a forum for rigorous frontier research on the microeconomic foundations of environmental economics as well as the strategic and market consequences of environmental policies. Submissions from a wide range of perspectives and topics are welcome. We specifically invite theoretical and empirical papers on the following:

- Economics of environmental regulation (normative and positive issues)
- Emissions, technology, and contracts
- Climate Agreements
- IO and Environment
- Trade and Environment
- Sustainable growth

The proceedings of the conference will be eligible for submission for a Special Issue of *Annals of Economics and Statistics* co-edited by David Martimort and Laurent Linnemer.

Interested authors are encouraged to submit their proposal before June 10, 2017 at [annals@ensae.fr](mailto:annals@ensae.fr). Authors will be notified of acceptance by July 3, 2017. The submission date for the *Annals of Economics and Statistics* Special Issue will be January 31, 2018. Authors of accepted papers will be reimbursed for regular accommodation and transportation expenses for the conference. Authors whose papers are accepted for the conference are expected to submit their final paper to the *Annals of Economics and Statistics*. All papers will be subject to refereeing using the same standards employed normally for submissions.
